At 5,050' Fort Davis is the highest town in Texas. Located in the Davis Mountains of West Texas, this elevation provides a comfortable year round climate. The average summer high is 88° with low humidity, and the average winter low is 30°.

Originally a military post established in 1854, Fort Davis is nestled in the heart of the Davis Mountains. View spectacular scenery, abundant wildlife, unique geological formations, one of the darkest night time skies in the U.S. and historic buildings. A visit to Fort Davis will take you back to a time gone by without giving up all of the modern conveniences. Attractions

Davis Mountains State Park – Abundant and rare wildlife, 9 miles of hiking trails great for birding, and photos with spectacular views. H.E. Sproul Ranch – Visit the oldest family owned and operated ranch in Jeff Davis County. Historic Walking or Driving Tour– A one and one half mile tour describing 23 restored public buildings some of which date back to the late 1800's. (Copies available at the Chamber office.)

McDonald Observatory- One of the major astronomical research facilities in the world. Open 10-5 daily, the Visitor's Center has extensive exhibits, a theater, gift shop, and the Star Date Café. Solar viewing and guided tours are scheduled for 11am & 2pm daily. Star parties are held on Tues, Fri & Sat evenings giving visitors the opportunity to look through multiple telescopes and view different celestial objects.
